Submission Guidelines

Do you have a documentary or factual project with interactive or immersive storytelling potential? Can you envision your project as a playable game, virtual reality work, or large-scale immersive experience? Would you like the opportunity to develop your concept with leading experts in the field and craft a pitch for feedback from a panel of industry professionals?

Presented by AIDC and VicScreen, **Doc.Lab.Interact** is an interactive documentary storytelling lab giving nonfiction content creators the opportunity to take their idea to the next level with leading Australian interactive artists Ben Joseph Andrews and Emma Roberts. Participants will emerge from the program with a rapid prototype of an element of their project as well as a practice pitch to seek further partners and funding.

<u>Applications are now open</u> for Australian practitioners with a documentary or factual project in early development with interactive or immersive storytelling potential.

The Lab

Four project teams will be selected to take part in a two-hour rapid prototyping workshop during AIDC's Innovation day on Sunday 3 March. The teams will then undertake 1:1 pitch training with Andrews and Roberts to develop their nonfiction project into a ready-to-pitch interactive or immersive concept.

As part of the Doc.Lab.Interact program, participants will receive intensive workshopping and support from leading experts in the field to:

- investigate their project's interactive storytelling potential
- explore the most suitable format for their project
- learn language and tools to communicate their ideas to tech developers and collaborators
- map out their project from initial concept to rapid prototype; and
- develop a sound blueprint for pitching their interactive or immersive project

At the culmination of the Lab, all teams will prepare a pre-recorded pitch to be reviewed by Andrews and Roberts, VicScreen and AIDC. From there, teams will be given feedback as to which commissioners, exhibitors and/or festivals seeking projects in the interactive / immersive space may be suitable for their project.

This guide provides you with the necessary information you will need to apply for Doc.Lab.Interact 2024.

HOW TO APPLY

Applying is free and easy with no previous experience in interactive storytelling necessary. **Doc.Lab.Interact** is open to all Australian nonfiction storytellers looking to explore the possibilities for transforming documentary or factual projects into a new interactive or immersive work.

To submit, you just need to provide the following:

- 1. An outline of an idea (up to 2,000 words). Please include in the outline:
 - A story outline of current project including access to key talent/participants and use of pre-existing materials
 - Describe why and how it will be suitable for an interactive or immersive format
 - Outline your initial interactive format preference (i.e. playable game, MR [Virtual Reality, Augmented Reality], online interactive documentary, large-scale immersive experience etc.); and
 - Provide a description of who you envisage as your key audience and what you would ideally like the audience to experience from your interactive or immersive work.
- Materials to support your outline. This could include key scenes (of no more than ten (10) minutes) from your project including animations, character studies and / or pitch decks, etc.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CONCEPT IS SELECTED?

Selected applicants will be notified and two project representatives invited to take part in Doc.Lab.Interact with the first workshop to take place at AIDC 2024 on **Sunday 3 March 2024** at ACMI, Fed Square in Melbourne / Naarm. Ideally, participants will attend the workshop in person, however consideration may be given to participants who need to take part virtually upon written approval.

It is free to submit an Application, however if selected, Applicants are required to purchase (at minimum) an <u>AIDC 2024 Sunday Pass</u> for all members participating in Doc.Lab.Interact with a minimum of one (1) participant and a maximum of two (2) participants per selected project.

Prior to the workshop, participants will:

• Take part in one (1) online mentoring session with Emma Roberts and Ben Joseph Andrews to discuss your project concept.

Following AIDC 2024, participants will:

- Take part in one (1) online mentoring session with Emma Roberts and Ben Joseph Andrews to receive pitch feedback, guidance and support.
- Develop a pre-recorded pitch for the Lab Producers, AIDC and VicScreen panelists
- Receive feedback as to which commissioners, exhibitors and/or festivals seeking projects in the interactive / immersive space may be suitable for their project.

More information will be provided to teams that are selected.
